ORDER EXTENDING FOURTEENTH EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ORDER INCLUDING CAMERON COUNTY EMPLOYEE MASK MANDATE AND REQUIREMENT FOR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC DOING BUSINESS IN COUNTY BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES TO WEAR MASKS

WHEREAS, pursuant to Texas Government Code Section 418.108, Cameron County Judge Eddie Treviño, Jr., declared a state of local disaster on March 16, 2020, due to the imminent threat arising from COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 418.108(b), on March 21, 2020, the Cameron County Commissioners Court approved Cameron County Commissioners Court Order Extending Coronavirus/COVID-19 Disaster Declaration; and

THEREFORE AND ACCORDINGLY PURSUANT TO THE TEXAS DISASTER ACT OF 1975, THE COUNTY JUDGE HEREBY ISSUES THIS EXTENDED FOURTEENTH EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ORDER INCLUDING CAMERON COUNTY EMPLOYEE MASK MANDATE AND REQUIREMENT FOR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC DOING BUSINESS IN COUNTY BUILDINGS AND FACILITIES TO WEAR MASKS AS FOLLOWS:

Effective as of 12:01 p.m. on Friday, May 7, 2021, ("Effective Date"), and continuing until Monday, June 7, 2021, at 12:01 p.m. unless extended, modified, or terminated early by the County Judge:

NOTE: IF THE NUMBER OF POSITIVE CASES SPIKES OR SURGES, THE COUNTY JUDGE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO RETURN TO A MORE RESTRICTIVE ORDER.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDER CONSTITUTES AN IMMINENT THREAT TO PUBLIC HEALTH.
